It is intended that this Weill Cornell CME activity will lead to improved patient care. At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

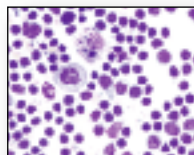
- ▷ Identify cytologic criteria of various non-neoplastic and neoplastic entities
